### **BAKING**

#### **Rules**

- All exhibits are to be placed on a styrofoam or sturdy paper plate (NO glass plates) and to be placed in your own plastic bag secured with a twist tie or in a Ziploc bag. No cling wrap.
- No ready mixes or prepared filling are to be used, unless otherwise stated.
- Squares to be cut into 1 ½" squares.
- Pies are to be baked in a foil plate and are to be tempered. To temper: place foil pie plate in heated oven at 400° to 450° F for 10-15 minutes before using. This helps brown the bottom crust.
- A true woven lattice top must be used on pies when requested.
- No paper liners are to be used on muffins or cupcakes.
- If previously frozen, item must be thawed and date made attached. Fresh will take preference.
- Judging will refer to Home Craft Judging Standards unless otherwise stated.
- Absolutely no cannabis or cannabis by-products allowed.
- Only 1 entry per category.

#### **Culinary Arts Champion Rules**

- Open to exhibitors 15 years of age and older.
- All Judged pies will be auctioned off at the Friday night show.
- The exhibitor winning the most points will be declared Culinary Arts Champion. Winner is eligible every 2 years and will be invited to attend the Friday Night Show to receive awards.

## **Butter Tart Competition**

with **NO** fruit, **NO** nuts, **NO** raisins, **NO** pecans.

### **Rules**

1. Rules the same for local Fair as District and Provincial.
2. Entry must be made solely by the person entering competition. (including pastry).
3. Competition is open to all exhibitors.
4. Number of butter tarts to be shown at local Fair/Exhibition to be determined by each individual Fair/Exhibition.
5. District/Provincial Competition Rules must be posted in the prize book of each local Fair/Exhibition. - NEW

## **District Competition**



6. The entrant must have won the butter tart competition at the local Fair/Exhibition to be eligible to enter the District Competition.
7. The size of the tarts must be full size tarts. (no mini or bite size tarts)
8. A total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. - UPDATED
9. Tarts must not contain fruit or nuts (i.e., no raisins, no pecans) - UPDATED
10. Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name and address using the entry tag provided. - UPDATED
11. Prize money to be paid by the District.

### **Provincial Competition**

12. The entrant must have won the District Competition to be eligible to enter the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Competition at the convention.
13. In the case where the District winner is unable to send an entry to the convention then the 2nd prize district winner will be eligible to enter.
14. The size of the tarts must be full size tarts. (no mini or bite size tarts)
15. A total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. - UPDATED
16. Tarts must not contain fruit or nuts (i.e., no raisins, no pecans) - UPDATED
17. Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, address, and District represented using the entry tag provided.
18. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place entries will not be returned to exhibitor but will be placed for auction at the convention.
